1. "Canticle Year," encompassing the 2013 – 2014 academic year, involves education and activities in and outside of classroom to promote the care of creation by monthly focus upon one aspect of the *Canticle of the Creatures*.

3. The Canticle Year is a campus-wide involvement experience. Built upon the foundational value of community, the interactions in and out of the classroom will focus on deepening the Franciscan understanding of and promoting the care for creation using St. Francis of Assisi's The Canticle of the Creatures. The faculty has been asked to incorporate Reverence for Creation related content in their course syllabi for the academic year. Student Life will incorporate Reverence for Creation in their activities.

August Convocation (faculty and staff)

- 1. President's address: emphasis on the value of community linked with caring for each other.
- Explanation of the movement from FAN Workshop, Deepening Franciscan Identity:
 Teaching Care for Creation, to where we are today will move the day into the Reverence
 for Creation value.
- 3. Prayer: experiencing visually the *Canticle of the Creatures*: PowerPoint of pictures to correlate to the poem which is song in Umbrian
- 4. Presentation on the spirituality of the *Canticle of the Creatures* by a theology faculty member
- 5. Explanation of the Canticle Year project: monthly handouts, request for inclusion of care for creation education in syllabi, and brainstorming monthly ideas in small groups
- 6. Commissioning Service: within the prayer service is the distribution of a tangible symbol for the year, a variety of large nuts. These are often put in offices as a reminder of the year's Franciscan value.

Handouts:

- 1. Study guide divided in half horizontally; the *Canticle of the Creatures* on one side and the other side blank for taking notes. Franciscan pencil drawings on both side of paper.
- 2. Bookmark containing the *Canticle of the Creatures* (made in-house)
- 3. A business size card will be distributed monthly highlighting the emphasized symbol for that month.

- 4. Activities corresponding to each emphasized symbol (water, sun, etc.) will take place
- 5. Large posters announcing the Canticle Year and monthly topic will be posted on campus.

- August: reverence for each other -Praise and Thanksgiving to God
- September: Sister Water
- October: Brother Fire
- November Sister Death
- December Sister Moon
- January Sister Stars
- February Brother Sun
- March Brothers Wind and Air
- April Mother Earth
- May All Creation

Activities

- 1. President will send a message to all students welcoming them to *The Canticle Year*

- 3. White butcher paper will be placed on a wall in the cafeteria to allow for interactive activities to be posted, information given, and theme announced.

- 5. Have a point person to receive communication of planned projects, spontaneous projects, faculty generated projects (Ex. in January one of the staff will present "Tour of the Night Sky" using her iPad app.
